As I reflect during Advent on the past year and look forward to celebrating the coming of Christ at Christmas I can only conclude that 2011 has been a another busy year with many people experiencing the love of Christ through the exceptional work of parish care programs and the consistent hard work of Co-Ordinators and Volunteers.

During the year we have enjoyed visiting many parishes throughout the Archdiocese, including as far afield as Kalgoorlie. New care programs have now commenced operation in the Mount Lawley Parish (St Paul's Community Care) and the Claremont Parish (St Thomas Care) and we are excited to be working with a number of other parishes who are considering the introduction of a care program in the New Year.

Due to increasing demand the John Paul Care program, in the Willetton Parish, has expanded the services of its Journey to Peace Support Group (formerly Bereavement Support Group) to include other grief and loss such as separation and divorce, loss of jobs, physical and mental illness.

A conference for Co-Ordinators entitled 'Live in the Present Moment' was held in May which was followed by a Springtime Gathering for Co-Ordinators in September.

We were pleased to receive a Mandate for Catholic Outreach from the Archbishop in April. The Mandate was formerly presented at a Commissioning Mass for Agencies in November.

In accordance with our Constitution we have seen the retirement from the Committee of Management of Brian Parry (Chair), Fr Thai Vu and Sr Catherine Ryan. We are deeply grateful for their leadership and contribution. During the year we were pleased to welcome Sr Marion Beard PBVM, Roger Walsh and Fr Karol Kulczyck SDS to the Committee of Management and look forward to continuing our work with them.

Finally on behalf of the Committee of Management and all those you have helped we wish you and your family a holy, joyful and peaceful Christmas and a happy and safe New Year.





Live in the Present Moment

In May a Co-Ordinators Conference was held entitled Live in the Present Moment at the beautiful beachside Retreat Centre of St John of God at Shoalwater Bay. Keynote speakers Celia Joyce M.P.S. and Stephen Truscott S.M., Ph.D. from the Fullness of Life Centre engaged 30 attendees with a workshop about the possibilities of living life more fully in the present moment using the Lifeframe as a tool.

A workshop on the contemporary Church in Australia was given by Brian Parry, Chair of Catholic Outreach. Jim Smith shared the work of Catholic Earthcare Australia which responds to Pope John Paul II's call for an "ecological conversion" of the world's Catholics. Peter Mc Minn, Director facilitated a workshop relating directly to operational aspects of care programs.









In mid September a Springtime Gathering for Co-Ordinators was held at the Catholic Pastoral Centre. Claire Sherwood, Dementia and Memory Community Centre Co-ordinator from the Alzheimer's Australia WA addressed the Co-Ordinators on 'Dementia Care - Information for Volunteers'. It was a very informative presentation about the effects of dementia on the sufferers themselves, their carers and family members.

Sr Marion Beard gave a very enlightening insight into the operation of 'The Sister's Place', a night shelter for homeless women and her direct involvement as a volunteer. This event was very well attended with approximately 25 people present.
