Dr Michelle Jones is the Director of the Centre for Faith Enrichment (formerly the Maranatha Centre for Adult Faith Formation) in the Archdiocese of Perth. Michelle is passionate about discovering the living flame of love within the Church's theological tradition and helping others to encounter that love. Her areas of interest include Spirituality, Christology, Trinitarian Theology and Scripture.
